We know that there are still many variables at play. We're keeping a careful eye on the situation and plan to make a final decision as we get closer. For now, though, we're going ahead with plans for a **hybrid conference**, which means that you can go ahead with plans to attend either **in-person or virtually**! Given the dynamic nature of the situation we're in, we will be completely flexible with registration changes, so no need to "wait and see." The conference is happening one way or the other, and we're looking forward to seeing you there!

NECTFL 2021 will be hybrid – what does that mean?

- Everyone's safety is paramount. We'll be working closely with the Hilton to ensure proper social distancing and safety in all locations. This may mean some changes to how we usually do things, but we're up to the challenge and we know that the new "hybrid" normal is going to be with us for some time to come.
- Attendees may register to attend in person or virtually. 
