Fordham Law Professor, Center on Race, Law and Justice Associate Faculty Director and critical race relations expert Professor Hernandez's new book *Racial Innocence: Unmasking Latino Anti-Black Bias and the Struggle for Equality* is the first comprehensive book about anti-Black bias in the Latino community that unpacks the misconception that Latinos are "exempt" from racism due to their ethnicity and multicultural background. In this Author meets Reader session, Professor Hernandez will be joined by Smith College Professor of Africana Studies, Pablo José López Oro; Ford Foundation Senior Program Officer Juliet Mureriwa, and Associate Human Rights Specialist at the New York City Commission on Human Rights, Abraham Tejeda in a discussion about her book.



Welcome to the new school year and SHH

This email is to all AATSP members who indicated high school as their primary teaching level. If you are not the SHH sponsor at your school, please check to be sure the sponsor received this email. If

you do not have a chapter, you may disregard the email. If you would like to verify or update your chapter account information, please contact <u>SHH@aatsp.org</u>

To maintain an active SHH chapter and be eligible to purchase graduation regalia, sponsors must ensure they do the following each year:

- 1. Maintain a current AATSP membership (Memberships expire December 31 each year.)
- 2. Ensure the SHH chapter is active (Chapters are marked inactive after no inductees are registered the previous school year.)
- 3. Register SHH inductees online via the Student Induction Form and pay each inductee's \$5 membership dues

These steps must be followed before a student is eligible to participate in SHH related activities, including induction ceremonies, scholarships, awards, and *Albricias*. <u>A sponsor may not order official merchandise</u> (including graduation regalia) from the AATSP Store until the above <u>steps have been completed.</u>
