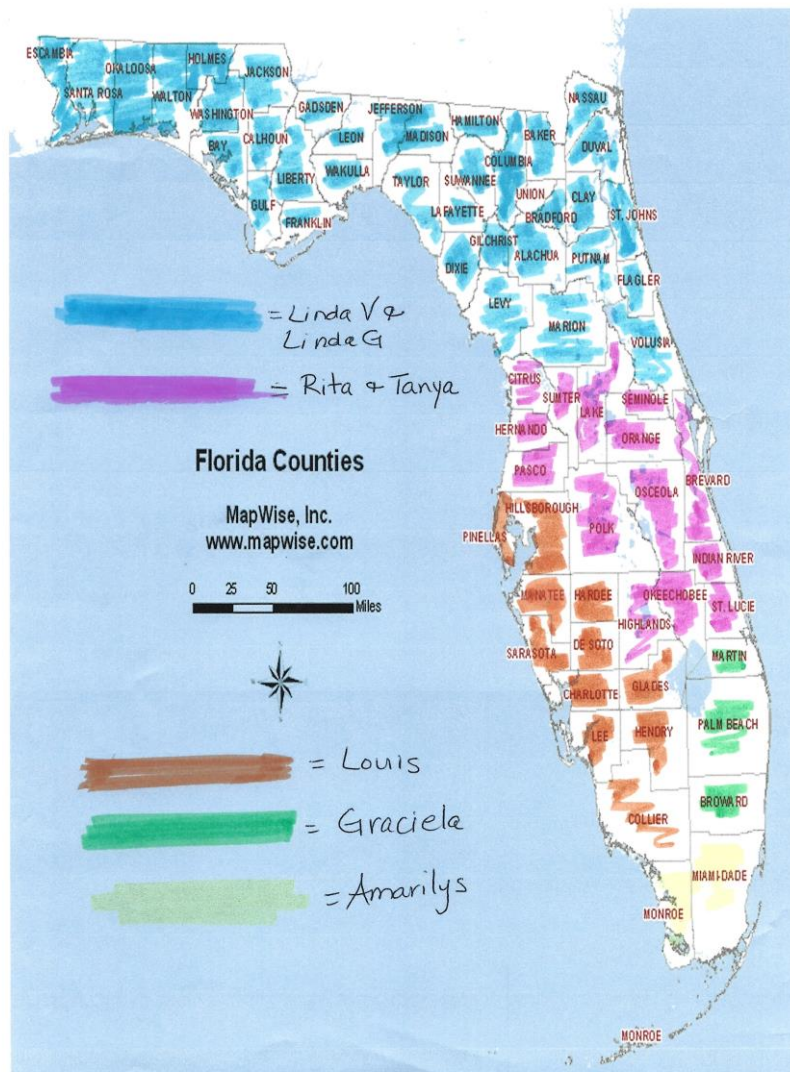

Marking the end of Hispanic Heritage Month and in anticipation of National teach Portuguese Week, we are pleased to announce the launch of a new student publication: Revista Luso-Hispánica.

Filling the gap between the AATSP's two other student publications - Albricias, for high school students, and the Spanish and Portuguese Review (SPR), for graduate students – Revista Luso-Hispánica (RLH)'s mission is to promote and recognize scholarship and artistic expression by undergraduate students of Spanish and Portuguese. Accordingly, the journal's scope of publication includes academic papers, interviews, and book reviews related to the study or teaching of Hispanic and Luso-Brazilian languages and cultures, as well as creative works of writing, such as poems, short stories, and other works of fiction. Advanced Placement (AP) students can submit proposals for their academic papers to be included in RLH.

The inaugural issue of this journal will be unveiled at the AATSP national conference to be held in Portland, OR from June 29 to July 2, 2024. We invite undergraduate students enrolled in community colleges and universities to submit their work for publication in RLH. Submissions must be written in Spanish or Portuguese and sponsored by an instructor with an active AATSP membership. All published work will appear with short bios of the student and the sponsoring faculty member.

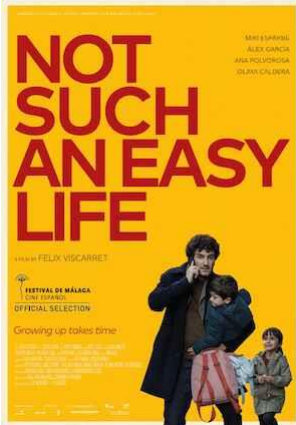


“Recent Spanish Cinema” is back in Miami for its 2023 edition, showcasing some U.S. premiere films and with some special guests coming from Spain.

FROM RAFAEL DEL MORAL, AEPE (Asociación Europea de Profesores de español)

Su artículo en Vozpópuli

NI CHINO NI HINDI, EL ESPAÑOL ES LA SEGUNDA LENGUA DEL MUNDO

Que el español es la segunda lengua del mundo lo sabíamos, pero la publicación del informe 2022 del Instituto Cervantes lo actualiza. El inglés ocupa, con diferencia, la primera posición en todo, salvo que es nativa de solo unos 373 millones. Como lengua necesaria y útil aparece, con mayor o menor destreza, en boca de unos dos mil millones de hablantes, el 25% de la población mundial; para el español unos 600 millones, 7,5 % de la población mundial.

El español es la segunda lengua en Internet, en textos de carácter científico, en Facebook, LinkedIn, YouTube, Twitter y Wikipedia (número de usuarios). El interés por aprenderlo es especialmente intenso en países anglófonos. En ellos se concentra casi el 40 % de los estudiantes. Si consideramos la universalidad como característica esencial, las lenguas de más utilidad entre las diez más habladas, son el inglés, español, francés, portugués y ruso.

El francés, rico en tradición cultural, no llegó a ser lengua de transmisión generacional fuera de Europa, salvo en los territorios franceses de Ultramar y en Canadá. Ahora pierde fuelle en Argelia, por ejemplo, donde las autoridades académicas lo sustituyen por el inglés como lengua de enseñanza.

En cuanto al ruso, tienden las antiguas repúblicas soviéticas a deshacerse de la lengua de quienes consideraron opresores. Países como Polonia o Hungría ya lo han desalojado. Otros como Ucrania, Georgia o Armenia intentan excluirlo con irregular fortuna. Bielorrusia lo mantiene vivo. Es importante señalar que tanto en Moscú como en Minsk la enseñanza del inglés es habitual, pero no podríamos decir lo mismo de la enseñanza del ruso en los países anglófonos.

El portugués es la lengua más hablada en la mitad sur del planeta, pero en el hemisferio norte se reduce a la nación que lo vio nacer con unos diez millones de locutores. Entre las diez lenguas más habladas sin dimensión internacional encontramos al mandarín, hindi, árabe, bengalí y urdu.

Como las estadísticas se deben interpretar con precaución, topamos con el primer desajuste, pues el chino mandarín ni es lengua vehicular fuera de sus fronteras, ni viaja. Sí es, tanto en número de hablantes como en tradición cultural, una de las más ricas de la humanidad por varias razones, todas ellas relacionadas con una cultura milenaria mal conocida en occidente.

El hindi, lengua muy extendida en India y oficial junto a otras dieciocho, cuenta con dos inconvenientes: sus limitaciones como lengua de cultura y su fragmentación. Los lingüistas hablan del crecimiento de ocho importantes dialectos que avanzan hacia la condición de lengua. A eso añadimos que la mayoría de la ampliación cultural de sus hablantes se desarrolla en inglés. Carece,

por tanto, de hablantes monolingües cultos, si el lector considera que no es una exageración decirlo así para que se entienda bien y rápido.

El árabe, será tajante, ya no es una lengua, sino muchas. Lo que existe como unidad es un uso estándar para la escritura llamado fuṣṣḥā usado en medios de comunicación. Algo así como el latín medieval una vez formadas las lenguas románicas. El árabe oral son dialectos distantes unos de otros: egipcio, libanés, palestino, jordano, marroquí o dariya, tunecino, argelino... La formación universitaria de quienes tienen al árabe como lengua materna se formaliza en inglés o en francés.

Casi la totalidad de los habitantes de Bangladés hablan bengalí, lengua de sólida y de milenaria tradición literaria y una de las más destacadas de Asia. Pero la lengua no tiene vida independiente o tiene poca porque el inglés es ampliamente hablado y comúnmente entendido.

La posición del urdu, décima lengua en número de hablantes, es realmente accidentada. Es lengua oficial de Pakistán junto al inglés, aunque solo el 8 % de la población la hereda en el seno familiar, el resto la aprende en sociedad. Hindi y urdu son fueron la misma lengua, que a veces fue llamada de manera conjunta indostaní. El inglés está presente en todos los niveles de enseñanza, especialmente en la universitaria.

Más allá del número de hablantes

Solo el español y el inglés son grandes lenguas internacionales en expansión, está claro, pero no debemos concedernos más de lo que significamos en el contexto mundial. En el *Baromètre des langues dans le monde* de 2022 que publica el Ministerio de Cultura francés, los factores que describen el peso de una lengua son el número de hablantes, claro, y muchos más: el número de países donde se habla, el factor vehicular, el estatus, el número de traducciones a partir de esa lengua, el número de traducciones hacia esa lengua, la presencia en Wikipedia, la enseñanza a nivel universitario, el índice de desarrollo humano, el índice de fecundidad o transmisión generacional y la presencia en Internet. Al convertir estos parámetros aleatorios en numéricos y sumar los índices, la lengua que ocupa el primer lugar es, una vez más, el inglés. Y ahora viene la sorpresa, la segunda es el francés. Se podría pensar que lo han hecho a propósito para inflar su chauvinismo. El tercer puesto lo ocupa el español, y los siguientes pertenecen al alemán, ruso, italiano, sueco, rumano, portugués y polaco, en ese orden. Sorprende ver al sueco y el rumano en séptimo y octavo lugar, y sorprende mucho más que el chino mandarín ocupe la posición decimoquinta y el hindi, árabe, bengalí y urdu ni siquiera aparezcan entre los veinte primeros.

A diferencia del mandarín, la nuestra sí es una lengua universal; a diferencia del francés, tiene asegurada la transmisión generacional; a diferencia del ruso, no es rechazada en ningún país del mundo, salvo la marginación en la enseñanza, que no en el resto de los ambientes, en Cataluña y el País Vasco; a diferencia del hindi, árabe y bengalí, es una lengua de hablantes monolingües que se usa en la enseñanza universitaria; y a diferencia de muchas de ellas como el hindi y el árabe no tiene signos que anuncien su fragmentación.

La demanda de español ha crecido tanto que supera, tal vez, a la de francés. Lo argumenta un informe de la prestigiosa página Duolingo, plataforma de aprendizaje de idiomas, en la que, de un total de 19 lenguas ofrecidas, el 53% de los usuarios elige mejorar su inglés, el 17% español y el 11% francés.

Es evidente que, tras el inglés, la siguiente lengua de peso en el mundo es la que ha servido para la redacción de este artículo.

Osceola County School of the Arts and Celebration High School, the host schools for the **2024** Florida State Spanish Conference, invite your school to participate in this year's conference. The purpose of this conference is to bring together students who have demonstrated knowledge of the Spanish language and who have expressed an interest in competing in the following areas: impromptu speeches, declamation, and dramatic presentation. The theme for 2024 is "*Español, más que una lengua, un tesoro*". We will be attaching a letter from the host schools explaining the cultural project with the next Circular.

Dates

March 7-9, 2024

Location

Wyndham Orlando Resort, 8001 International Drive, Orlando, FL 32819

Eligibility

Set by Florida Statutes for Interscholastic Competition

Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA or better for the grading period immediately preceding the competition, and they must have passed five of seven or five of six classes.

Divisions

There will be two divisions with equivalent trophies awarded for each division. * The maximum number of delegates representing any one school is **sixteen**.

Division I: 70% or more of total delegates must be in category A, with a **maximum of 30%** of total delegates in categories B, C, and D.

Division II: more than 30% of total delegates in categories B, C, and D.

Competitions

There are three types of academic competitions.

Impromptu Speeches

Every student will give a two-minute discourse on a given topic. A list of sample **topics is available on the website: www.thefssc.org** under the **"HOW IT WORKS"** tab, find **TEMAS** page, **click on even years button**. Please note that the **topics HAVE CHANGED**. Each school may have up to sixteen delegates on the team; however, **all** delegates must participate in Impromptu Speeches.

Declamation

A **maximum of six** delegates may compete in an **oral presentation of a poem (1 min minimum for all students in levels 1A, 1B, and level 2A; 2 min. minimum for levels 1C, 1D, and 2B through level 6**. Declamations are **not to exceed 3 minutes**.) *Costume and movements of interpretation are permitted and encouraged. NO INSTRUMENTS OR SINGING OF THE DECLAMATION.*

Dramatic presentation

Each school may enter one skit or short play, through which a triple-point value will be obtained. **THE PLAY MUST BE OF SPANISH ORIGIN – A SPANISH AUTHOR – OR AN ADAPTATION OF ONE.**

Level of Spanish Proficiency

Students will compete according to the level of the class in which they are enrolled (Spanish I-VI). Students enrolled in an AP Spanish class should be listed according to the numerical level corresponding to their years of study of Spanish. There is no AP category, therefore **AP Language** is considered **five years** and **AP Literature** is considered **six years**. Also, students will be classified according to their level of proficiency:

- A. Students have ONLY learned Spanish in the classroom.
- B. Students with limited outside experience at home or in a Spanish-speaking environment.
- C. Students with extensive outside experience.
- D. Students reared and educated in a Spanish-speaking environment.

Judging

Two judges will rate each delegate based on diction, interpretation, and overall performance.

Awards

Each entrant will receive one of four assessments: "**Bueno**", "**Excelente**", "**Superior**" and "**Sobresaliente**".

In each of the school-size groupings defined by the Florida High School Activities Association (**7A, 6A, 5A, 4A, 3A, 2A, and 1A**) an outstanding school will be named in each division based on total points accrued by its delegates.

To have a chance at a trophy, a school must enter **ALL** three areas of competition with the maximum number of competitors allowed in each category.

Individual students may choose to participate in the non-academic regional dress and/or entertainment (singing, dancing, musical instrument) competitions at the banquet for personal awards, but these scores will have no bearing on the outstanding school award. Each school may also enter one scrapbook and a poster depicting the conference theme.

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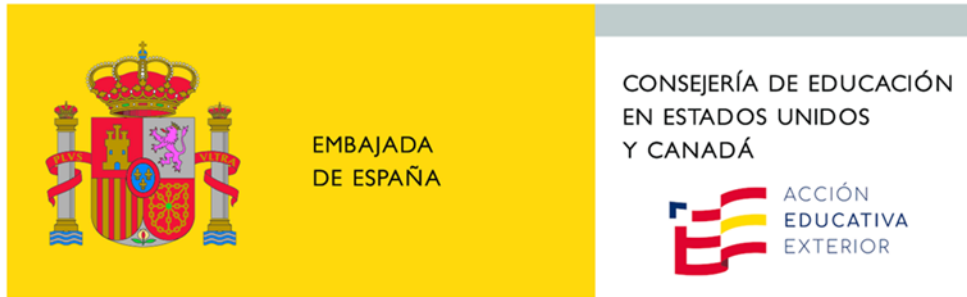
