Point Problems

As you all probably noted, we had some problems with the points this year.

When you send in your forms from the circulares, the information is immediately entered into an Excel spreadsheet that we'll use to tabulate points. The formulas are pre-loaded in the form and all usually goes well.

This year somehow an older form was used with only 12 spaces for Impromptu events and 5 for Declamations. The folks who worked very hard to enter all the info into the document accommodated by adding additional lines in the areas so that 16 Impromptus and 6 declamations could be accommodated. They had no idea that the formulas would be thrown off.

"Alejandro discovered the problem when he was helping to troubleshoot an issue with a judging sheet on Friday afternoon," says Pam Benton, FAATSP president and point room supervisor, "we tried to update all the forms, but it's pretty hectic in the point room on Friday and the lines just start swimming after a while."

Unfortunately, a few of the mistakes weren't caught. Luckily, that's why we have teachers check their forms carefully.

We sincerely apologize for the stress and inconvenience caused by this anomaly and we'll make sure it doesn't happen again. All individuals involved in the data entry and point tabulation are clear on the issue and everything will be triple-checked for the future.
